



Fellowship group questions

- Read through the whole of Psalm 2 together. What bits of the psalm stand out for you—do you really like, struggle with, or not understand?

- Who are the nations plotting against (v1-3)? How and where do we see this today? Where does this touch our lives most obviously? How does it feel to think of the world as being an enemy of God?
- As you read v4-6, how do you feel about the Lords response? What, from your own life, shapes the way you understand it?
- How do we reconcile the Son of v7-9 with the Jesus we know from the New Testament? Why should we be thankful for the Son of v7-9?
- What are we instructed to do in v10-12. How serious are you about these things? What of these do you think you need most help with?
- What does it mean to take refuge in him?

Pray for one another, asking each person to share one thing they would like praying for from the verses, and one thing for the coming week.
