



Questions for growth groups

1. Try indicating to the others an emotion just using the expression on your face. Ask the rest of the group to guess what you're conveying.
2. When you stop to try and imagine what God might look like, what do you see?
3. Be quiet for a minute - If you could imagine the face of the Father right now, what expression would he have on it?
4. The younger son left the Father and spent his inheritance – can we ever get far enough away from God to not be allowed back into his house? Can you think of examples of someone who has returned to the Father after falling badly?
5. The elder son was loyal and faithful but also jealous of his father's mercy and joy – if you are honest are there times when you have felt bitter as a Christian? What is the cure for this?
6. "Be perfect as your Father is perfect" – how can we become like the father if he is perfect?

Some trickier questions

1. In Exodus 33:11 we are told "The LORD would speak to Moses face to face, as one speaks to a friend". But then in verse 20 He says "you cannot see my face, for no one may see me and live." How to resolve this apparent contradiction? See also Genesis 32:30; Num 12:8; Judges 6:22.
2. In Esther we read "Just as the king returned from the palace garden to the banquet hall, Haman was falling on the couch where Esther was reclining. The king exclaimed, "Will he even molest the queen while she is with me in the house?" As soon as the word left the king's mouth, they covered Haman's face." (Esther 7:8) – what does this mean?



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
