

Some of these questions are personal and others are more general. Feel free to pick and choose which questions your group will find most helpful.



1. Read the verses again. What are the most challenged thoughts and ideas in these verses?
2. Remind yourself of 1 Corinthians 15v1-11. What is the link with today's verses? Why is this important for the Corinthians, and us to remember?
3. What do you think of the idea that we were made for more than our current experience of life? Do you find it encouraging or difficult?
4. Look up John 12v23-26. What is the link between Jesus being glorified and him dying?
5. Bearing in mind 1 Corinthians 15v36-42, how has 21st century society got our view of the body wrong, and right. Is it the same in every culture? How?
6. How does v42-44 make you feel about life now and the life to come?
7. 'The Kingdom of heaven is not simply a 'return to eden'; it is more.' Had you ever considered this before. What do you make of it?
8. How does knowing those who trust Christ will 'bear the image of the heavenly man' impact you. How might this shape your thinking and perspective day by day? How should it affect the way we work, spend time with family and rest?
