## Because death is not the end

1 Corinthians 15:35-58

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1. What did the Lord most impress upon you from the talk on Sunday morning? Were there any bits you struggled with?
2. Think about the use of the words 'changed', 'raised', 'clothed'/put on' and 'inherit'. Look back through v35-58. Why does Paul use these words? How do they help describe what will happen on that day?
3. How does v52 make you feel? Do you ever think about it? Why?
4. God gives us 'Victory' (v57). Remind each other what this means, and how he does it. What most excites you about this?
5. How natural do you find 'praise'? (v57) How can you be more thankful for these things?
6. Why does Paul encourage the Corinthians to stand firm and let nothing move them? Where do you need to hear the same encouragement?
7. When you think of the 'work of the Lord', what do you think about? Think back through 1 Corinthians. What might Paul mean by this?
8. Does your life feel as though living for Jesus is not in vain? How can we encourage one another to believe, experience and live this out?

Pray that we would remember and live in the light of these things.
